Кроме этого, во время пребывания в Японии, JICE оказывает стипендиатам помощь при поиске и выборе жилья, регистрации, открытии счета в банке и т.д.

Требования, предъявляемые к кандидатам:

- **Гражданство:** Республика Таджикистан;
- **Возраст:** до сорока (40) лет на 31 июля 2025 г;
- **Текущий род занятий:** Постоянные служащие целевых организаций Проекта JDS;
- **Стаж работы:** не менее 2 лет (на постоянной основе) в Целевых организациях JDS, включая не менее 1 года в текущей организации по состоянию на 31 июля 2026 г.
- **Степень образования:** высшее (наличие диплома специалиста или степени бакалавра);
- **Знание английского языка:** достаточное для обучения в магистратуре

Военнослужащие, а также лица, получавшие правительственные стипендии других стран на получение степени магистра за рубежом не могут участвовать в Проекте JDS 2025.

Процедура отбора на участие в Проекте JDS 2025:

I тур (январь 2026) Проверка документов профессорами японских университетов

II тур (февраль 2026) Техническое интервью с профессорами японских университетов

III тур (апрель 2026) Всестороннее интервью с членами Управляющей комиссии Проекта JDS

По окончании процесса отбора

После успешного прохождения всех 3 отборочных туров, 15 финалистов:

- С помощью JICE подают заявки в выбранные университеты Японии для получения приглашения на учебу.
- Вылетают в Японию в августе 2026 года.
- Приступают к учебе в выбранном Университете в сентябре или октябре 2026 года.

- Получить письменное разрешение от Вашего руководства на участие в Проекте на специальном бланке, который приложен к форме заявки.
- Заполнить электронную форму заявки на английском языке на сайте JDS, выбрав один компонент и один университет.
 - *Важной частью заявки является написание плана исследования в рамках выбранного компонента – именно его оценивают профессора.*
- Подготовить и загрузить все необходимые дополнительные документы.
 - *При этом важно помнить, что в число необходимых документов входит разрешение от руководства организации, в которой работает кандидат, на участие в Проекте JDS.*

I. Application Guidelines

1. About JDS Scholarship

The Project for Human Resource Development Scholarship (**JDS**) was launched by the Government of the Republic of Tajikistan with the assistance of the Government of Japan in 2008.



JDS is funded by the Government of Japan through its ODA (Official Development Assistance) budget.



JDS targets young government officials who are expected to play a leadership role in the development of their countries.




JDS provides scholarships to government officers to study at two-year Master's degree courses (instructed in English) of Japanese universities.

Objectives of JDS

- **To Support for Human Resource Development**
JDS's objective is to strengthen the government's administrative capacities in the Republic of Tajikistan, through providing the opportunity to obtain the Master's degree for the young capable government administrators who are expected to engage in formulating and implementing social and economic development plans and to play a leadership role in the development of the country.
- **To Enhance Bilateral Relationships**
JDS fellows are expected to solidify foundations to further bilateral relations with Japan by utilizing their human network developed through academic and social activities while in Japan.

2. System of JDS Tajikistan

The approach of JDS gives its importance on "selection and concentration" on the target priority issues to enhance effectiveness and efficiency of the program. A single program (One phase) is designed to accept four batches of Fellows (Fellows in each fiscal year constitute one batch), and this is the fourth batch in phase four in the Republic of Tajikistan.

English Proficiency	Have a good command of both written and spoken English. TOEFL –ITP score of 500 or higher is preferable.
Health Condition	Mentally and physically in good health. To be eligible for the scholarship, applicants must be in good condition physically and mentally from the time of application to the time of return to the home country after completion of his/her course in Japan. In case there is a drastic change in Fellow's health condition before his/her departure to Japan, and if the university which the Fellow goes to considers his/her condition not suitable for the pursuit of academic goal, the scholarship may be cancelled, based on the decision/guidance of the university.
Ineligibility	A person who corresponds to the followings are not eligible to apply <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Those who are currently receiving (or is scheduled to receive) another scholarship (including other scholarships of Japan). Those who have obtained a master's or higher degree overseas under the support of foreign scholarship. Military personnel and military civilian employees registered on the active list, and also personnel on temporary leave from the active list.
Others	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> JDS Fellows are obliged to return to the Republic of Tajikistan on their graduation in order to make a contribution to the development of the Republic of Tajikistan through their work in their organization or JDS Target Organization for at least five (5) years. The Government of the Republic of Tajikistan requests the successful candidates to sign a pledge letter on the conditions deemed necessary as scholarship fellows under the JDS Project. In case that they should violate the pledge, the scholarship will be automatically terminated, and other necessary steps shall be taken.

4. JDS Operating Committee (OC)

JDS Operating Committee (OC) is the decision-making committee of JDS Project. It consists of both members of Tajikistan and Japanese governments. The OC not only sets the framework and selection policies but also evaluates candidates in the final selection.

¹ The applicants who would like to use the score of TOEFL-ITP taken under the project last year, or the one of TOEFL-iBT or IELTS obtained within 2 years as of June 30th, 2026, by themselves, can be exempted from the English exam based on their request to JICE JDS Project Office in Tajikistan. For those who need to take Math test, refer to the chart of "Academic aptitude test" above.

7. Award Benefits

Once accepted as a JDS Fellow, you are entitled to receive following support from the project.

JDS has specific rules in order to realize its project goals and to ensure favorable study environment for the Fellows.

- Full tuition fees
- Air fare
- Arrival allowance
- Accommodation allowance
- Monthly Scholarship
- Book allowance
- Travel and seminar attendance allowance
- Special Program Expenses
- Overseas travel insurance
- Support from the agency
 - Finding accommodation
 - Initial settlement of your life in Japan
 - Emergency situation etc.

Before departure

- JDS Fellows must submit a JDS pledge to the Operating Committee to commit themselves to follow JDS Rules.

During the stay in Japan

- It is highly recommended to bring JDS Fellow's family members after 3 months have passed from the date of arrival and enrollment. Scholarships are provided to only one JDS Fellow, so JDS Fellows themselves are responsible for the procedures and costs related to their family calling.
- JDS Fellows are prohibited from
 - Working
 - Driving motor vehicles
 - Applying for further studies such as a doctoral course in Japan
- JDS Fellows must complete the study within the predetermined period of study and return to his/her country immediately after the study completion.

After returning to home country

- JDS Fellows must attend a report back meeting held by the Operating Committee.
- JDS Fellows are obliged **to return and work in the Republic of Tajikistan at least 5 (five) years** in compliance with the Act of Pledge required by Agency of Civil Service under the President of the Republic of Tajikistan.

Further details will be explained after the selection.



II. How to Apply

1. Application Documents

1) List of Required Documents

You are required to upload the following documents in the online application system.

Please make sure that you have prepared all the documents before you start your application.

- Only one file can be uploaded for each document, therefore please combine the documents into a SINGLE PDF in advance, if necessary.
- All documents written in other languages than English need official English translation. (Self-translation is not acceptable.)
- Submit "Reason Letter", if any of the documents cannot be submitted by the deadline for unavoidable reasons, or any wrong information (e.g., wrong spelling of name, birthday, etc.) is contained in the documents.
- As for University Certificate/Transcript, Reference Letter, and TOEFL or IELTS certificates, JICE may request you to submit the notarized copy of your certificate if you are selected as a final candidate.






2. Tips on Application and Selection (Reference)

The better you prepare for the Application Documents, the more chances to pass the selection you have. Here are some tips on the preparation of Application Form (AF) and Research Plan (RP).



Before making the application documents, you are advised to...

Collect information, Analyze the information, and Analyze yourself!



In answering the questions, it is very important to keep in mind that **those questions are NOT separate questions** - they are very coherent in the sense that each question asks [who you are / what you are doing now], [what you want to do in Japan] and [what you can / want to do after your study]. Therefore, those questions ask how you relate your career and the study in the context of the development of Tajikistan.

- Tips for the selection

(1) Understanding JDS

Objectives and framework

The objectives of JDS are written in **P3**. “Sub-Program and Component (SP/CP)” and “Targeted Organizations (TO)” are shown in **P16**. But, here, most importantly, you have to note the reasons why JDS is provided to the government sector, why SP/CP and TO are set in the JDS framework. The answers to those questions will be an important basis in making preparation for AF and RP.

- *JDS is designed to support the human resource development of Tajikistan.*
- *Government sector can directly and widely contribute to the development.*
- *SP/CP are set based on the development plan of Tajikistan and Japan aid policy.*
- *TO (You and your workplace) are considered to be closely involved in the development.*

(2) Country analysis

As mentioned in “(1) JDS analysis” above, “SP/CP” is set based on the development plan of Tajikistan (Rectangular strategy, NSDP, etc.). First, read and understand the background of the SP/CP you wish to apply for (**PP17-19**) to know what kind of development issues are assumed and what kind of research are expected under JDS. Then, obtain information on development issues of Tajikistan (Rectangular strategy, NSDP, Issues of your organization, etc.) to deepen your understanding on the status of the development. This analysis of present development status will be important not only for making a RP but also for later selection steps (interviews).

- *Read and understand a background of the SP/CP you apply for (**PP17-19**)*
- *Check such materials as NSDP, issues of your organization, etc.*

(3) Organization task analysis

As shown in "JDS framework (P15)", TO is set under each CP and considered to be closely related with the development issues (P16). Therefore, it is essential for you to know what kind of mission your organization has in the context of the development of Tajikistan. Also, it is important to observe what kind of issues your organization is tackling and what are lacking to solve the issues. Those observations will help you conduct further analysis.

- Check missions and roles of your organization in the context of the development of your country.
- Also observe what is necessary in your organization to solve the development issues of your workplace. Those observations will help you find reasons to study in Japan.

(4) University research

As shown in "JDS framework (P15)", the relevant Japanese universities (courses) are designated under each CP. Those universities are selected to offer you with sufficient knowledge in order to tackle development issues of your concern. As the universities wish to recruit students with the necessary academic level and high motivation to learn, you need to demonstrate those points in the following way.

- One of the ways to show self-motivation is to demonstrate how much you know about the university you are applying for.
- Go to the university website to know their location, history, provided courses, the faculty members, etc.
- Find interesting professors, and check their research areas, current activities, their published academic papers, etc.

(5) Career plan

As you can see in Prescribed Form, you will be required to submit **Short Essays** ([Q1] Responsibilities of Your Work, [Q2] Reason for Applying the Graduate school / course, [Q3] future contribution), and **Research plan**. Those are very coherent in the sense that each question asks [who you are / what you are doing now], [what you want to do in Japan] and [what you can / want to do after your study]. So, those questions ask how you relate your career and the study in the context of the development of your country. This is a clear tip to answer to those questions in AF.

- Your answers to Short Essays and Research Plan are very coherent.

About "Responsibilities of Your Work" (Q1 in Short Essays)

Due to lack of understanding of the connections among [Q1], [Q2], [Q3] in Short Essays and Research Plan, some people do nothing but list up their daily work for Q1. As mentioned above, it is important to show your current (or previous) work in the context of the development issues in order to bridge your answers to the next questions (Research Plan and career plan after study).

- Q1 in Short Essays just ask your current and previous work. But, based on your answers in this question, the interviewers (The university and OC) try to guess if you can use acquired knowledge in your work after you return from Japan. Therefore, Q1 and Q3 in Short Essays are two sides of the same coin.

About Research Plan (Prescribed Form)

The details about how to write Research Plan (RP) is explained in (P11). On the basis of the explanation above, keep in mind that the RP is considered as an extension of your responsibility of your work [Q1], which will lead to your career plan after you study in Japan [Q2].

About contribution after study in Japan (Q3 in Short Essays)

You may have a problem in answering to this question about how you will contribute to the development and bilateral relationship with Japan after your study in Japan. Considering the objectives of JDS, these are very important factors through the selection process. Here you are required to show your potential for future contribution through your research, based on your background in the workplace. Just answering such as "I will share my knowledge", "I will teach at educational institutions" would not attract interviewers.

- If you have finished the analysis in (2) ~ (4) above, you should be able to identify the needs of your country and organization as well as your tasks to fulfill such needs.
- It is important to layout your future career plan (after your study in Japan) in relation to the needs of your country and organization, which also will be a solid and good reasoning to study in Japan!

(6) Research on relevant issues in Japan

The JDS Fellows are to conduct research on development issues of their home countries. And also, taking into account that they study in Japan, you are also recommended to know in advance, at least, about historical and empirical cases of Japan in your research field.

(7) Test preparation **※IMPORTANT**

As shown in "Selection Process (P5)", the results of English and Math tests will be reviewed by the universities in the 1st selection (AF and RP screening by the universities in Japan) and afterwards.

- It is strongly recommended to prepare for those tests, improving your ability by self-study. You can prepare for both tests in advance!
- About TOEFL test, getting used to the test format using sample test and textbooks.

It is recommended you watch it for your preparation, also please refer to the information below too.

(1) Guideline for writing research plan

In the application for JDS, the research plan for your Master's thesis should :

- Address the current issues/problems of the socioeconomic development of your country and how to remedy these issues/problems.
- Present a detailed work plan on how and what you will do to achieve the goal of your study.

The research plan, which is submitted for the application is not deemed to be final. It will be revised during the course work in line with the Component. The purpose of the research plan is to help its readers (faculty members of graduate schools) evaluate the significance and potentiality of your research from the following aspects:

- 1) Does the research plan address the important policy questions of the applicant's country?
- 2) Does the research plan show that the applicant is strongly motivated and adequately prepared to implement the research successfully?
- 3) Who will benefit from the result of the research? Will the result of the research contribute to solving or clarifying policy questions which are important for applicant's country?
- 4) Does the research help the applicant to participate in

the development process of your country more effectively after the completion of the course?

- 5) Is the applicant's academic background strong enough to implement the research plan?
- 6) Is the applicant's work experience sufficient to pursue the research? (Not necessary if other application material is good enough to show that the answers are positive.)
- 7) Does the research plan fit well with the program of the graduate school?
- 8) Are the applicant's research questions academically significant?

The importance of each point above, however, depends on the field of study and the graduate program you are applying for. Some graduate programs may require more specific information about the data and method of analysis. Therefore, it is essential to go through the "University Information" as well as the website of the university carefully before writing your research plan. Writing a research plan is the beginning of your research. It is highly recommended that you keep improving your research plan before departure to Japan after being selected as a JDS Fellow.

(2) Outline of the research plan (Example)

Title		Describe the nature of your proposed research clearly. Avoid making it too short or redundant.
Introduction	Background	Position your research theme here to <u>state a significance of your research in the research areas</u> . The literature review is not a part to merely describe preceding studies <u>but to sort out what research has been done, what have been found and what are unknown in your research field</u> . Also consider relevance to development issues and your organization. List the preceding studies in a reference section at the end of your research plan.
	Literature Review	
	Purpose and Questions	<u>Shape and clarify what you want to achieve by your research. It is recommended to think about research purposes at a higher level not in your daily duties.</u> The research itself is not the purpose. Your research is supposed to contribute to the development of your country and institutional development of your organization. As for the research questions, set your questions in relation with the preceding studies above, development issues of your country and organization, also taking into consideration your research methodologies. <u>With solid research questions, the research methodologies will be clarified accordingly.</u>

(3) Warnings about “Plagiarism”

“Plagiarism” is a serious offense in the academic field. Plagiarism means using other person’s ideas and words without explicitly acknowledging the source of that information.

University students including JDS applicants and Fellows are members of the academic and must not commit plagiarism in making a research plan and thesis. Otherwise, you may be disqualified from the selection, or even be discharged from the university, once plagiarism is found in your research plan, or academic work at the university.



Such cases are deemed as plagiarism:

- Copying from books or articles written by other authors without permission
- Copying from an internet source without referring to the attribution text or information
- Misrepresentation of someone’s work as one’s original

To avoid plagiarism, you must cite sources and give credit whenever you use:

- Other person’s idea, opinion, or theory
- Any facts, statistics, graphs, drawings – any pieces of information – that are not common knowledge
- Quotation of other person’s spoken or written words, or
- Paraphrase** of other person’s spoken or written words



When you make your research plan, also pay attention to “**Paraphrase**”.

Paraphrase is a re-expression of other person’s ideas in your own words. There is an accurate and inaccurate way of paraphrasing.

A Passage Appears in a Source

Critical care nurses function in a hierarchy of roles. In this open heart surgery unit, the nurse manager hires and fires the nursing personnel. The nurse manager does not directly care for patients but follows the progress of unusual or long-term patients. On each shift a nurse assumes the role of resource nurse. This person oversees the hour-by-hour functioning of the unit as a whole, such as considering expected admissions and discharges of patients, ascertaining that beds are available for patients in the operating room, and covering sick

Critical care nurses have a hierarchy of roles. The nurse manager hires and fires nurses. S/he does not directly care for patients but does follow unusual or long term cases. On each shift a resource nurse attends to the functioning of the unit as a whole, such as making sure beds are available in the operating room, and also looks after a patient.

Word-for-Word Plagiarism

Patchwork Paraphrase

Chase (1990) describes how nurses in a critical care unit function in a hierarchy that places **designated experts** at the top and the least senior staff nurses at the bottom. The experts — the nurse manager, nurse clinician, and clinical nurse specialist — are not involved directly in patient care. The staff nurses, in contrast, **are assigned to patients and provide all their nursing care**.

4. FAQ (Frequently Asked Questions)

Program

Q1. What is the Sub-Program (SP) and Component (CP)?

They are the fields of study determined according to the priority development issues of Tajikistan. JDS Fellows are expected to prepare the research plan in line with the stated issues. You are encouraged to study in advance the Sub-Program / Component under which you apply for JDS.

Q2. Is JDS a full scholarship?

YES. All the costs to study in Japan will be fully covered by JDS scholarship. For further details, please refer to "Award Benefits" in this booklet.

Q3. Can I apply for any university/course in Japan?

NO. The component and university are determined according to the priority development issues of each JDS recipient country. You can select the component / university from the framework.

Q4. Can I extend my stay after the completion of a program?

NO. Every JDS Fellow MUST return to their country by the designated date after graduation in compliance with the pledges required by the JDS Operating Committee. JDS Fellows have an obligation to return to the belonging organization and contribute to the socio-economic development of the country with acquired knowledge and skills.

Eligibility

Q5. I am working for a private company, but I have work experience at a government office. Am I eligible?

NO. The requirements are "Currently employed in the Target Organizations as a full-time employee."

Q6. I don't have two years of work experience at the current workplace. Can I count my previous work experience?

NO. Two years of work experience at the current workplace is necessary. Only work experiences at parent-subsidiary organizations and the same organization can be counted.

Q7. I have already received a scholarship from another country. Am I eligible to apply for JDS?

NO. The following persons are NOT eligible to apply for JDS.

- Persons who are currently receiving or are scheduled to receive other scholarships.
- Persons who have already obtained master's degree in other countries under any scholarship.

(*) However, persons who are studying in master's course or obtained master's degree without foreign assistance local/foreign universities are eligible.

Application

Q8. Where can I get the Application Form?

Please access JDS website: <http://jds-scholarship.org/> The prescribed forms, Application Guidelines (AG) and university information can be downloaded from this website.

Q9. Can I apply for two components (universities)?

NO. You cannot apply for more than one component. Please select one component which is relevant to your work responsibility.

Q10. Should I submit all the application documents by the deadline?

YES. But in case you cannot submit some of the documents due to unavoidable reasons, please inform JICE in advance and submit the letter of reason with your signature.

Q11. I cannot get a permission letter from my workplace. Can I apply without the letter?

NO. In JDS, it is important to return to the workplace after study completion. Therefore, permission from the workplace is required.

Selection

Q12. Do I need to take the English test?

YES. Basically, every applicant must take the English examination (TOEFL). However, applicants who have valid TOEFL score will be exempted from the English test. If you don't have a valid score, JICE will arrange the English exam.

Q13. Is the Math test required?

NO. The math test is required for the applicants applying for the Ritsumeikan University, International University of Japan.

Q14. Do I need to come to Dushanbe for the interview?

YES. For the applicants from outside Dushanbe, JICE will provide a transportation subsidy.

Inviting Family

Q15. Can I go to Japan with my family?

Technically NO, due to visa application procedures. It is highly recommended that you bring your family to Japan starting from 3 months after your arrival in Japan. However, some accepting universities have stricter rules.

JDS students themselves are responsible for the procedures and costs related to their family inviting.

	Tajikistan is located at the junction of East Asia, South Asia, Europe, Russia, and the Middle East. In addition to being close to major powers such as Russia and China, sharing a long border with Afghanistan, having complex historical relationships with the CIS countries of the former Soviet Union makes Tajikistan a geopolitically complex and important region. In particular, there have been rapid changes in international relations surrounding Tajikistan's neighbors, such as the Taliban's seizure of power in Afghanistan and Russia's invasion of Ukraine. For this reason, Tajikistan's basic policy is an all-round diplomacy that emphasizes balance, but in the absence of alliances with reliable neighbors, it has developed a multi-faceted diplomacy that emphasizes the United Nations, which supported the peace process during the civil war, and participated in various multilateral and regional economic agreements.	
	Meanwhile, in Central Asia, while Tajikistan has built good relations with Uzbekistan through summit diplomacy in recent years, it is facing two border conflicts with Kyrgyzstan in 2022. From the perspective that regional cooperation to resolve common regional issues is indispensable for the stability and development of Central Asia, Japan has been conducting the "Central Asia plus Japan dialogue" Foreign Ministers' Meeting since 2016, with the aim of cooperation to help a free and open Central Asia maintain and strengthen the international order based on the rule of law and implement sustainable development. In Tajikistan, there is a need for an early resolution of the conflict with Kyrgyzstan and the establishment of sustainable peace.	
The JDS program is expected to build good relations with the countries concerned so that it contributes to the sustainable economic and social development of Tajikistan, and to develop human resources who will be responsible for formulating and implementing diplomatic policies in line with international affairs, and policies to deal with geopolitical and international issues.

Purpose of Study (Background of CP)	<p>After the civil war that lasted from 1992 to 1997 following independence, Tajikistan has been experiencing solid economic growth since 2000, but the gap between urban and rural areas is widening. Also, there has been no shift in the economic structure, such as diversification of industries and high value-adding that accompanies growth, the country's fragile economic structure is still highly susceptible to the external environment, with approximately 30% of GDP dependent on remittances from migrant workers abroad. The unemployment rate has been worsening since 2016, reaching 7.7% in 2021, and the unemployment rate is particularly high among young people, who make up the majority of the population. The majority of households receive remittances from abroad, with Russia being the major destination country for Tajikistani labor migrants. Although the Russian invasion of Ukraine has not had a significant impact on overseas remittances in the short term, the weakening of the Russian economy due to the prolonged war is expected to significantly increase the unemployment rate in the future due to the return of people, and it is anticipated that the scale of social assistance, including employment measures, will need to be greatly expanded.</p> <p>Tajikistan's "National Development Strategy 2016-2030" aims to improve people's living standards through sustainable economic development, and promotes overcoming economic fragility, increasing the added value of industries, promoting import substitution and exports, and focuses on creating jobs, especially in rural areas, through support for entrepreneurship and SMEs in the manufacturing sector such as processing domestic agricultural products. Japan's country assistance policy to Tajikistan is having the basic policy of "supporting the development of a country capable of sustainable and stable economic and social development," and JICA has set "development of economic and industrial development infrastructure" as a priority area and is working on "development of business environment to promote employment." The JDS program is expected to complement these efforts mentioned above by fostering young administrative officials and practitioners who can formulate and implement economic development policies such as macroeconomic, fiscal, and monetary policies, private sector revitalization, and the establishment of related institutions.</p>

It also states that it will promote innovative approaches in all aspects of socioeconomic development, including infrastructure development, energy efficiency, and improvement of basic social services, and development policies, investment plans, and organizational and institutional reforms related to these areas are needed.</p> <p>The JDS project is positioned as part of JICA's "Human Resources Development Program for Government Officials" and is expected to foster young government officials and practitioners who will contribute to innovative development by acquiring advanced knowledge in new information and communication technologies, as well as in improving public sector organizations and institutions such as the civil service system, public investment, and decentralization.</p>	

IV. Special Trainings and Events

JDS Program provides the following opportunities for JDS Fellows only in addition to research at university.

Government Leaders Networking Event

This special event aims to establish long-term cooperative relationships between JDS Fellows and Japanese government officials by providing opportunities of interaction and mutual learning. JDS Fellows participate in the event and expand their personal networks with Japanese government officials, who would become their counterparts in the future.



Japanese Language Training

All JDS Fellows participate in Japanese language training after their arrival in Japan. This training provides Fellows with the lessons on Japanese characters (*hiragana, katakana, and kanji*), greetings, and how to introduce themselves. In addition, they deepen their understandings of Japanese culture, lifestyle and manners, and learn the procedures necessary for staying in Japan such as government office, post office, and bank.



JDS Pre-return Program

JDS Pre-return Program is held half a year before returning home, inviting all JDS Fellows from each university.

During this program, the Fellows have opportunities to attend a series of programs, including leadership program and a special lecture given by a prominent scholar. It also helps them build a network with JDS Fellows from various countries.


