<b>Background</b>	<p>The "New National Development Strategy 2022-2026" calls for faster economic development and a higher rate of economic growth. In particular, the country has increased its borrowing of foreign public debt to foreign capital, and has begun to develop its economic infrastructure, including infrastructure projects, and has begun to focus on PPP-based development. In addition, the government has taken measures to create an appropriate competitive environment by reducing preferential treatment for state-owned enterprises and privatizing inefficient projects.</p> <p>The Presidential Decree of December 2022 has decided on a large-scale reorganization of ministries and a 30% reduction in the number of employees, making policy making and implementation in the government sector more elite than ever, making it essential to strengthen the capacity of individual civil servants. In addition, to improve the management of state-run enterprises and privatize them, it is essential to develop market-oriented human resources.</p>
